This past December I had the opportunity to attend the retirement of a gentleman that had spent 45 years as the head of admissions of a prominent school here in Los Angeles. Person after person spoke of the impact that Mr. V had on their lives. The way he went above and beyond to strengthen relationships, to invest in others, and stay connected.

I think that's what we all want to hear at the end of our career. What kind of impact and legacy did we leave? What will people say about us when we're done? Will they be helping you pack up your stuff and get you out of the office as soon as possible or will they be saying look at all they did to make the world a better place and be sad that you are leaving?

We believe in leaving a legacy here at the PDS Foundation and we have 120 people who are helping with that through our "Legacy Club". We couldn't do the work we do without their generous commitment every month and throughout the year.

Through the PDS Foundation programs, we aim to eliminate some of the stressful times in the lives of the people that we serve. We help to eliminate financial barriers for our dental assistant scholarship awardees. This year we received 235 applications as we expanded across the country and introduced the scholarship to 26 new schools. We awarded 55 scholarships across 12 states totaling over \$282,000.

There is no place that brings more relief than the Dentists for Special Needs office. The team, led by Dr. David Jourabchi and Michelle Krasch are answers to prayers for so many. The tears of joy that come from our patients and their families when they get the care they deserve, is so rewarding. I think of Eddie and his mom Debbie who touched our hearts and inspired us to do more. We are honored that you have chosen to give your time, talents and treasure to the PDS Foundation.

We are as excited as we have ever been for the work that still needs to be done in 2022. We can't wait to get back to Guatemala and support the team there. To elevate the dental assistant profession by overcoming financial barriers for the next generation of servant-hearted dental assistant leaders.




International Service Trips

Named after Dr. Carolyn Ghazal and her heart for service, the scholarship aims to mold the next generation of passionate, servant-hearted, dental assistant leaders. In 2021, 55 scholarships were awarded to students across the country totaling over \$282,500!

Her mother was diagnosed with cancer and she watched her go through so much including losing all of her teeth throughout treatment. 



INTERNATIONAL SERVICE

Although 2021 did not allow for any trips to be taken with the PDS Foundation, we were still able to make a difference in the world around us.

The PDS Foundation Clinica Dental in Xenacoj, Guatemala ended the year providing \$511,815 in donated dentistry to over 649 patients.

It is incredible to see the impact the clinic and the students have on their community. It could not happen with Hilda and Kevin who manage and maintain the clinic all-year-round.

In January 2022 we will welcome Dr. Rodrigo Letona Barillas as the clinic's full-time dentist. He will hold his role for 1 year as he applies for his master's program and we await the next round of residency students from the Universidad de San Carlos.


